What is the EU Road Safety Exchange?

A three-year twinning project (2019-2021) funded by the European Parliament and managed by the European Transport Safety Council on behalf of the European Commission

Supports real exchange of knowledge and best practice between EU Member States

The primary target audience are decision-makers and road safety professionals working in the authorities of the selected countries





What is the EU Road Safety Exchange?

Twelve participating Member States: Austria, Bulgaria, France, Greece, Ireland, Lithuania, the Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Spain and Sweden

Activities included thematic online workshops, on-the-ground study visits, bilateral follow-up and a final event in Brussels.

Six meetings between March and July 2020 with high level representatives to establish priority topics and twinning partners



















April 2022 - Study visit on URBAN SAFE INFRASTRUCTURE to SWEDEN with PORTUGAL


















Achievements
